Resetting Kano OS to Factory Settings

If you want to pass on the fun and give your Computer Kit to someone else, it's easy to remove your data and restore it to factory settings.

- Find the Terminal app on your Kano dashboard.
- From the command line, type `sudo kano-init reset` and press enter.
- If it asks for a password, type `kano` and press enter.

That's it! Your Computer kit will be reset to factory settings the next time you start up the computer!
