What is Zentangle Art?

Zentangle Art is an art technique that creates images by drawing structured patterns.

The patterns are created using combinations of dots, lines, curves, orbs and shapes such as circles, triangles and squares, and abstract shapes

Zentangle Art can be drawn in monotone (one colour) or be multicoloured.

Zentangle Art is unplanned with emphasis on focusing on each stroke rather than the finished work.

You may have an idea of what you want to draw but more often, the strokes and patterns will create an unexpected result.

Zentangle Art is meditative. Many people find it relaxing and reduces stress.

Materials Needed

Zentangle Art is low cost as the minimum requirement is a pencil or pen and a blank piece of paper.

Paper

- White copy paper. Colours such as pastels and neutrals work well too. Dark coloured papers can be used too with white or very light coloured pencils.
- Sketch books and art journals.
- Light card.

Pencils

- Lead pencils various gradings from HB to 6B, 8B etc. –
 Various gradings from the H range (2H, 4H etc). The B gradings are softer than the H gradings.
- Coloured pencils

<u>Pens</u>

- Writing pens
- Fine tip pens such as Artline 200, Sakura, Staedtler
 Triplus Fineliner brands. These brands produce fine tip
 pens of varying nib size such as 0.1mm to 0.8mm in black
 as well as a range of colours. The various nib sizes enable
 the artist to draw lines in different widths and vary the
 detail in patterns.
- Felt pens preferably with fine nibs.
- Copic markers preferably with fine nibs.

<u>Gel pens</u> – may not give as fine detail as the fine tip pens. Metallic gel pens can be used to add highlights.
